

# Learner Wellbeing Support Services Policy and Procedure

This policy and procedure supports the requirements to provide student support services to all learners attending a course with Australian Statewide Education and Training T/A Revive2Survive First Aid Training.

This policy ensures that all learners are given support while studying with Revive2Survive First Aid Training. This support includes both academic support and personal support and the following procedures ensure that learners are made aware of the support available.

## PROCEDURE

#### Learner Orientation

Upon enrolment and/or at the beginning of a course, the learners are to be given a short orientation and it must include the following:

- Information on the training facilities identifying student areas, toilets, break areas, fire exits, and restricted areas.
- Information on emergency evacuation procedures
- Information on how to access the student support services within Revive2Survive First Aid Training

## Nominated Learner Support Officer

Whilst all staff employed by Revive2Survive First Aid Training have the responsibility to provide support to all learners. Revive2Survive First Aid Training has nominated a 'Learner Support Officer' who shall be available to all learners, on an appointment basis, through the standard RTO hours of business.

Students can access the Learner Support Officer directly and an appointment will be organised as soon as practical.

#### Required Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN)

LLN is defined as an individual's ability to read, write, and speak in English, compute and solve problems at levels of proficiency necessary to function in the workplace and in society. Leaners will require LLN skills at the appropriate level to understand course content and be able to complete assessments.

If learners believe they may have difficulties with LLN, assistance will be provided, and alternative assessment methods may be offered. Learners are required to contact the office with any LLN concerns prior to attending a course. If deemed necessary Revive2Survive First Aid Training may recommend that you re-sit the course. If completing a course run via the blended delivery option, Revive2Survive First Aid Training may recommend that you attend both the theory and practical full days of a course to ensure a thorough understanding.



## Learner Support Services Referral List

Where employees of Revive2Survive First Aid Training are not qualified, or it is in the student's best interests to seek professional advice, the Learner Support Officer will provide links to external sources of support. All preferred/ suitable external links will be listed on the Student Support Services Referral List, which is also maintained by the Learner Support Officer.
